CORALPALOOZA™ 2019

Key Largo, Florida (June 7 and 8, 2019) - ANGARI Foundation is proud to have been an Ecosystem Sponsor for CORALPALOOZA™ 2019. R/V ANGARI and crew ventured down to the Florida Keys to provide operational support to Coral Restoration Foundation™ at their annual

event to restore coral reefs through coral outplanting. CRF reports that at this year's event, ~ 250 divers returned 1,760 corals to natural reefs in the Florida Keys - more than any previous CORALPALOOZA™ event.



OceanGate Deep Sea Submersible Makes Record-Breaking Dive in Bahamas; R/V *ANGARI* Provides Surface Support

The Bahamas (April 25, 2019) – Approximately 10 nautical miles offshore of Great Abaco, OceanGate broke a deep-sea diving record by transporting a crew of four on an abyssal descent to 3,760 meters onboard its *Titan* submersible. R/V *ANGARI* and crew were on site, serving as the main tow and surface support vessel for the dive.

Lake Worth Lagoon (April 2019) - The Lake Worth Lagoon Drift Card Study is a community-driven citizen science experiment to observe how currents in and around the Lake Worth Lagoon affect the movement of objects floating in the water. This past April marked the fourth time that drift cards were deployed for this project, and the event was featured in the *Palm Beach Post* article, "Why 240 bright pink wooden cards were dumped in Lake Worth Lagoon".

"Forecast: Shark Attack"

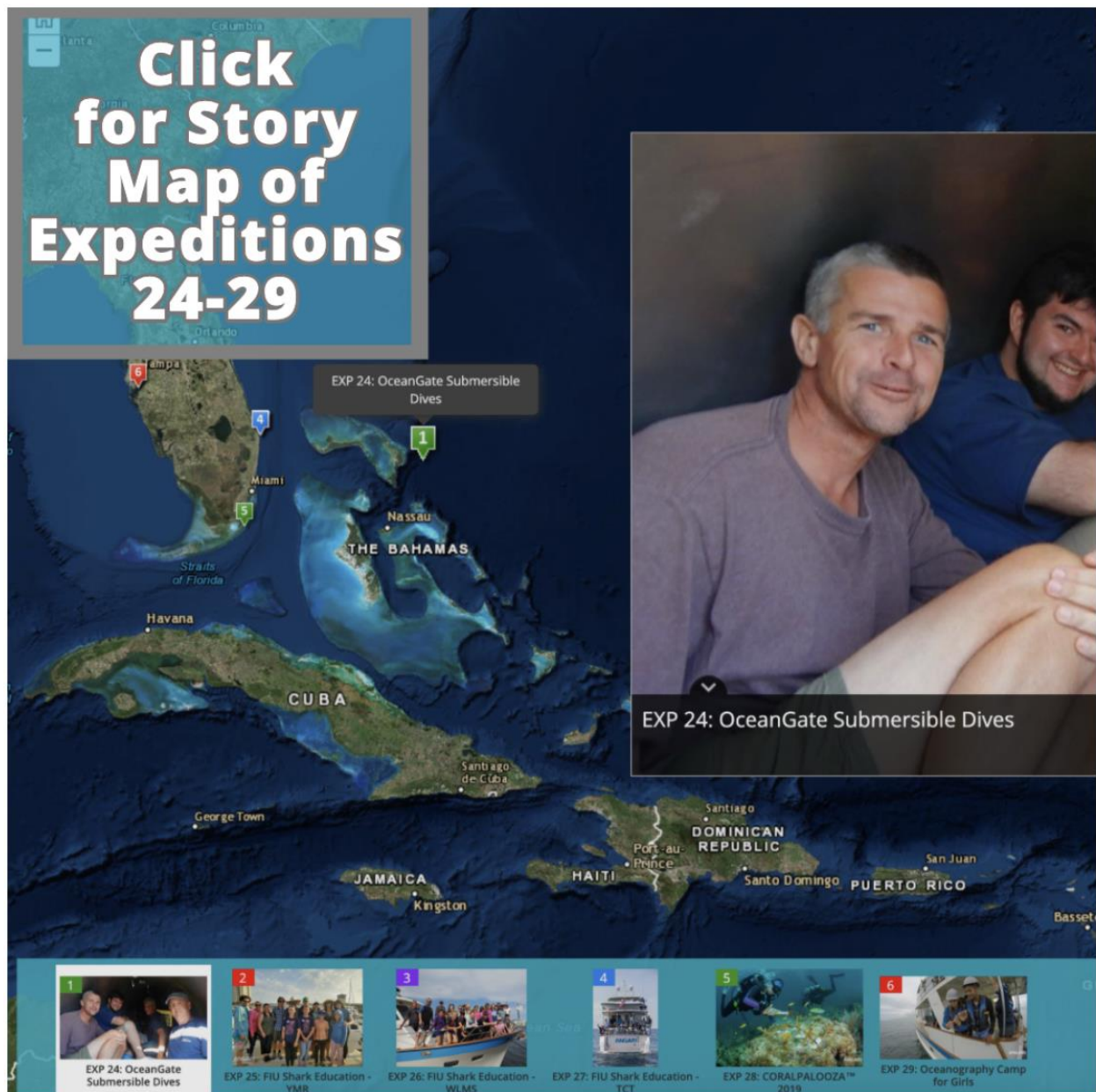
Date/time: Thursday, July 18 at 10/9c
